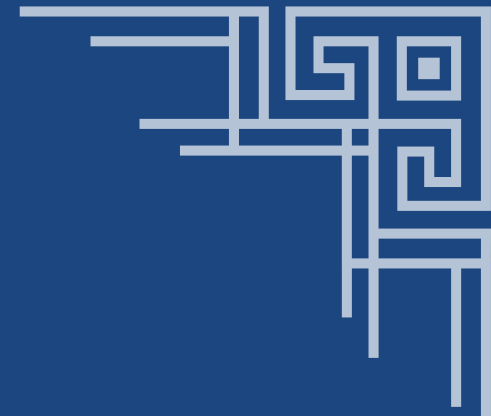

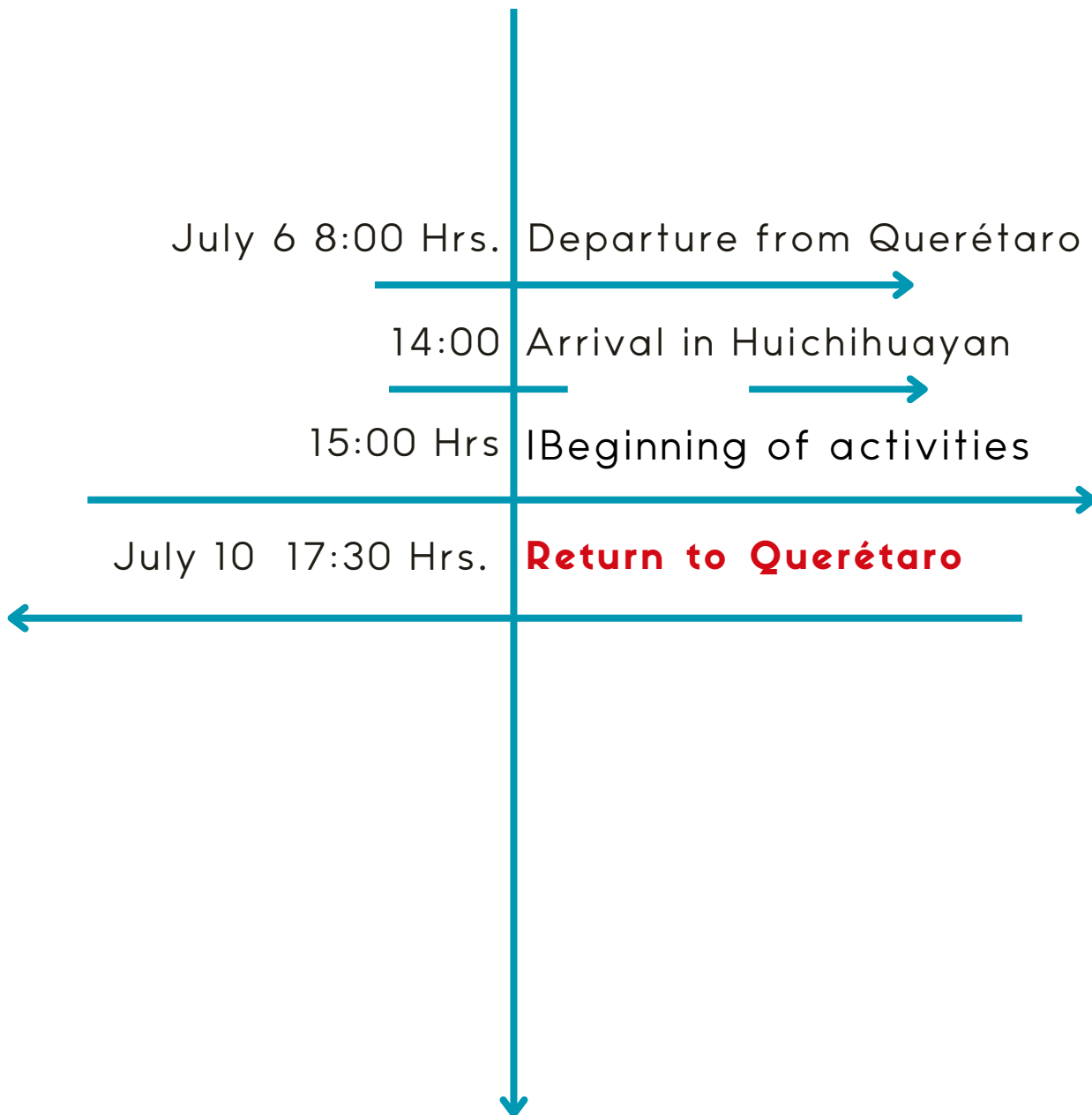

# Essential Recommendations


-  **Must-Have Items**

# Places You'll Visit

## HUICHIHUAYAN



Huichihuayán is a charming town and renowned natural attraction located in the municipality of Huehuetlán, San Luis Potosí. It is best known for its crystal-clear, shallow river, making it an ideal spot for swimming and stand-up paddleboarding while surrounded by lush tropical vegetation. As one of the most popular destinations in the Huasteca Potosina region, Huichihuayán offers breathtaking natural scenery, a relaxing atmosphere, and easy access for visitors seeking to experience the beauty of Mexico's natural landscapes.

## ARRIVAL AT HOTEL QUILAS

Upon arrival, you will check in at Hotel Quilas, a comfortable and relaxing property conveniently located near the attractions included in your itinerary.

# ACTIVITIES



## TAMBAQUE

This tour begins in Tambaque, where you will visit a natural spring with crystal-clear waters. The rock formations and the emergence of water at the foot of the mountain range create a stunning setting for swimming, surrounded by lush vegetation and a variety of bird species.

It is a breathtaking natural spot that offers visitors a unique opportunity to enjoy both relaxation and direct contact with the region's rich biodiversity.



## MANTETZULEL

The expedition continues to the Mantetzulel Caves, home to two remarkable caverns known as El Espíritu Santo and El Rayo del Sol.

These caves offer a unique natural setting where visitors can explore impressive rock formations and experience the mystical atmosphere shaped by light, water, and time.

# Places You'll Visit

## CASCADAS DE TAMUL



Discover the Huasteca Potosina and immerse yourself in this breathtaking natural wonder, located approximately 40 kilometers from Aquismón.

Here, you can navigate the Tampaón River by canoe or “panga” boat while admiring one of the most spectacular waterfalls in Mexico. This natural marvel is formed by the confluence of the Gallinas and Santa María rivers.

Its powerful emerald-green waters cascade from a height of 105 meters into the Santa María River, which flows through the bottom of a narrow and deep canyon with striking reddish walls. During peak flow, the waterfall can reach up to 300 meters in width, creating an unforgettable and awe-inspiring landscape.

# Things to Do

## BOAT TOUR EXPERIENCE

The boat ride (panga) to Tamul Waterfall in San Luis Potosí is a 3–4 hour ecotourism experience that allows visitors to immerse themselves in one of the most stunning natural landscapes in the region.



## VISIT TO LA CUEVA DEL AGUA

During the journey, you will stop at the natural cenote known as “La Cueva del Agua,” where you can admire its crystal-clear waters and enjoy the breathtaking scenery of the turquoise river along the way.



## LUNCH AT SANTA ANITA RESTAURANT

Enjoy a selection of traditional regional dishes at Santa Anita Restaurant, offering a taste of the local cuisine in a welcoming and authentic setting.

2:00 PM – Arrival at Ayutla River. Free time to have lunch at Campamento Los Sauces, swim, and/or walk (meal menu will be defined prior to the trip)

5:30 PM – Transfer to Jalpan de Serra

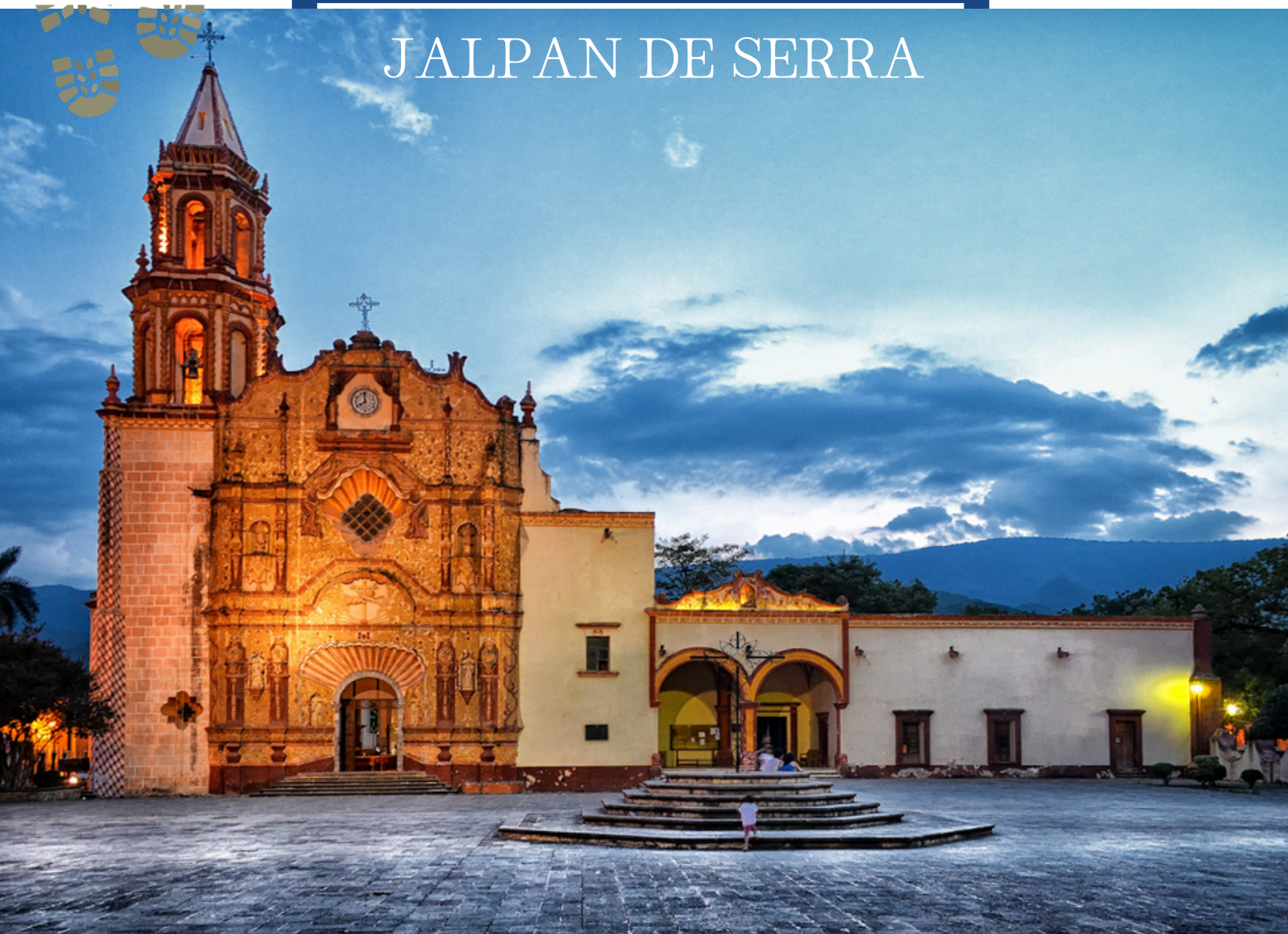
6:00 PM – Arrival in Jalpan. End of activities

# Places You'll Visit

## JALPAN DE SERRA



Jalpan de Serra, designated a Pueblo Mágico since 2010, is the heart of the Sierra Gorda region, home to Mexico's most ecodiverse Biosphere Reserve.

This destination offers an extraordinary blend of lush natural richness and the striking beauty of Baroque art found in the Franciscan Missions, a legacy of Saint Junípero Serra. These missions were inscribed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 2003, recognized for their outstanding cultural value and historical significance.



# Things to Do

## VISIT: CONCÁ MISSION



The Mission of San Miguel Concá, founded in 1744 in Arroyo Seco, Querétaro, is the smallest of the Sierra Gorda missions and stands out for its rich indigenous decorative elements. It represents the cultural blending of 18th-century Franciscan evangelization and was declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 2003.

## DISCOVER THE ANCIENT TREE

You will also visit the iconic ancient sabino tree located in the Sierra Gorda region, specifically in the community of Concá. This remarkable tree measures 22 meters in diameter and is considered the oldest of its kind in the region.

The Sabino of Arroyo Seco is one of the oldest trees in Mexico, surpassed only by the famous Tule Tree in Oaxaca, making it a truly impressive natural landmark.





# Things to Do

## REFRESH AT LAS ADJUNTAS

Las Adjuntas, located in the municipality of Arroyo Seco near Jalpan de Serra in the Sierra Gorda of Querétaro, is a unique natural spot where the Ayutla and Santa María rivers meet. This remarkable site is known for the confluence of two rivers with distinct temperatures and colors—one cool and bluish, the other warm and earthy—which do not immediately blend, creating a striking natural visual effect.



## VISIT THE SIERRA GORDA MUSEUM

Through its seven exhibition rooms, the Sierra Gorda Museum offers a journey through the historical evolution of the region across different periods of Mexico's national history. The exhibits are supported by archaeological findings, photographs, and documents that have helped shape the cultural identity of the Sierra Gorda of Querétaro.



## DISCOVER THE JALPAN MISSION

The Mission of Santiago de Jalpan is the oldest of the five Franciscan missions in the Sierra Gorda of Querétaro. Located in the heart of Jalpan de Serra, it is distinguished by its rich Baroque mestizo style, a unique blend of indigenous and European artistic traditions.

# Places you'll visit

## PEÑA DE BERNAL



Bernal is a town located in the Mexican state of Querétaro, within the municipality of Ezequiel Montes. It is well known for its location at the base of Peña de Bernal, considered the third-largest monolith in the world.

The town is part of the Bajío region and is a popular destination for its cultural charm, scenic landscapes, and proximity to one of Mexico's most iconic natural landmarks.



# Things to Do

## PINAL DE AMOLES TOWN

Pinal de Amoles is an ideal destination for hiking, ecotourism, and outdoor exploration. With its rich gastronomy, local traditions, and colonial architecture, this Pueblo Mágico preserves a rustic charm that transports visitors to another era.



### BREAKFAST AT MESÓN DE BARRETEROS

The Hotel Posada Restaurant Mesón de Barreteros is a historic and emblematic establishment located in the heart of Pinal de Amoles, a picturesque Pueblo Mágico in the Sierra Gorda region of Querétaro. It is well known for offering a traditional atmosphere combined with local cuisine.



### VISIT TO PEÑA DE BERNAL

Peña de Bernal is a rock formation created by an extinct volcano. It is frequently described as the third-largest monolith in the world, after the Rock of Gibraltar and Sugarloaf Mountain in Brazil. This iconic landmark is one of Mexico's most famous natural attractions and a symbol of the region.
